As I reflect on the extraordinary renewal our organization experienced last year, the words "strong and resilient" come to mind. As the pandemic receded, we continued to assist families and individuals most affected by the loss of employment and income and supported them with housing, healthy food, mental health, and other evolving needs.

Our work continues to be centered on advancing Latino community wellbeing, advocacy, and prosperity. We solidified the expansion of our Behavioral Health Clinic, now on track to become one of few culturally grounded Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics in the nation. We expanded the social-emotional care of Latino children, youth, and families and increased efforts around early childhood development. We ensured our motto "la cultura cura" (culture heals you) was at the core of

programming led by Latino artists. We invested in technical skills development for youth and adults to move them into higher-wage jobs and supported hundreds to launch their own businesses to increase their income.

In the coming year, we will turn our attention to developing our capacity to expand resources that meet the high demand for our programs by strengthening our systems, infrastructure, and capacity to increase the geographic reach and delivery of our services.

As we charge forward, the dreams of our community will always inspire our direction. The resilient dedication and strength of our staff and volunteers continue to create transformational impact for our community's advancement and Minnesota's recovery and growth.

We are grateful for your ongoing support and contributions. They continue to feed our capacity and give us the strength to tackle the persistent gaps faced by our community.

# Unidos y Más **Fuertes**

2022 was a time for reconnecting, reuniting, and building awareness of our community's resiliency and contributions to Minnesota's economic recovery. We gathered in person at Fiesta Latina, Gala Latina, and La Cultura Cura Arts and Cultural community engagement events to celebrate our cultural traditions, continue to build our own narratives, and to foster resilience and hope.

#### **Fiesta Latina**

- · Our community festival featured CLUES services, a Health and Wellness Village, Sports Village, Arts and Culture Village, community connections, and folkloric dancers.
- · 70+ grassroots vendors and 3,000+ attendees from across the Twin Cities joined us.

#### **Gala Latina**

- · CLUES 2022 Gala Latina highlighted Latinx youth, Latino Legislative Trailblazers, and our ongoing work advancing equity and inclusion of our community. CLUES raised more than \$70,000 for Youth Technology programs from individual donations and a matching gift from Best Buy.
- Guests visited with Latinx youth at tech stations who gained first-hand knowledge of the skills youth are developing at the CLUES Best Buy Teen Tech Center. We celebrated the legacy and work of three Latino Trailblazers whose groundbreaking work paved the way for many new Latino elected officials: Rep. Carlos Mariani, Senator Melisa Franzen, and Senator Patricia Torres-Ray. (photo Gala Latina awards)

#### **Arts Programming and Gallery**

- · Día de Los Muertos at Midtown Global Market drew 2,300 attendees to honor and celebrate our ancestors. Local Latino artists performed throughout the day while participants engaged in cultural art practices like papel picado, paper cempasuchil making, painting calaveras and making barriletes.
- · CLUES St. Paul Art Gallery featured several exhibitions throughout the year, providing a platform for local artists to share their work and foster community connectedness.

# Transformational Change

#### **Participant Stories**

#### VICTORIA H. A STORY OF RESILIENCE

As a U.S. citizen Victoria left Guatemala two years ago to give her son a better future and start a new life. The move to another country came with several daunting challenges for new immigrants including cultural and language barriers, as well as lack of access to basic

"Starting from scratch, without resources, without resilience. An acquaintance referred her to CLUES where she connected with a whole support network describes as beautiful but difficult. #### MR O. A STORY OF LEARNING AND SUCCEEDING FROM ADVERSITY

Mr. O was struggling to make ends meet due to the impact of COVID-19. He lost his job and could not afford to pay his rent. This put him at risk of being evicted from his home. "I didn't know where to turn for help since I don't have any family or friends in the U.S., that is why I decided to reach out to CLUES seeking guidance with my situation." CLUES assisted him through our emergency rental assistance program. As part of CLUES' action plan for Mr. O, we worked on financial planning, connecting him to housing resources, and exploring specific programs that provide job training and employment opportunities. The CLUES team focused on helping him achieve longterm financial stability to avoid falling into a similar situation in the future. "CLUES is the refuge I go to when I need help because I know they will always give it to me. CLUES is there whenever I need support and continues to be by my side," said Mr. O.

# **Advancing Community** Health and Wellness

**CLUES** advances Community Wellness by facilitating individual and collective transformation. healing, and wellbeing.

#### **Food Access**

- · Expanded capacity via stand alone food distribution
- Throughout 2022 CLUES has been working hard to expand our capacity to meet the growing needs. At the end of 2022 we opened a new location (771 Margaret Street- adjacent to our St. Paul Headquarters) that will serve as our standing food access-Canasta Familiar site. Thanks to generous contributions from donors, we purchased refrigerators, freezers, and food displays that support our new food market model for people to choose healthy cultural food options. Throughout 2022 we provided 503,698 pounds of food to 16,582 participants in the Twin Cities. We also distributed 5,970 Make-At-Home meal kits (average meal for family of 4) through our partnership with East Side Table.
- · Increased food distribution efforts in Greater MN-CLUES responded to increased food insecurity across the state by increasing our efforts to ensure families in Austin have access to free, culturally relevant, healthy food. We conducted bimonthly food distribution events reaching 3,567 participants with 165,147 pounds of food.
- · SNAP Outreach and Enrollment- While meeting the emergency food needs of families is critical, we are also focused on how we can support families needing ongoing food supports. Our team conducts SNAP outreach and enrollment in conjunction with our Canasta Familiar program. In 2022, we completed 524 screenings and processed 125 successful applications.

#### **Behavioral Health**

- · Becoming a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC)- CLUES is in the process of becoming one of the only Latino-led CCBHCs nationwide and aims to become certified mid-2023. CLUES has increased our Behavioral Health staff capacity and expanded our continuum of services. CLUES opened a new Behavioral Health clinic office in South Minneapolis in April 2022 to meet the needs of our clients.
- · Supporting healing- The pandemic brought about and amplified many different stressors among clients, and we continue to see the impacts on the mental health of our community. This year we provided culturally responsive comprehensive Behavioral Health services to 268 kids and 784 adults to support their wellbeing.

#### **Health and Wellbeing**

- · Advancing health equity via prevention through education- CLUES provides critical, culturally adapted health information to communities to address key health disparities. 635 teens were provided sexual health education in partnership with local schools. 58 participants received tobacco cessation education and resources, including connection to Quit Partner MN.
- · Connecting community to vaccinations, resources, and healthcare- Throughout 2022 COVID-19 continued to have a significant impact on our communities, including high level of infections early in the year. 2,820 individuals received COVID-19 vaccinations/boosters and 7,500 COVID tests were distributed. 105 individuals were enrolled in health coverage.
- Supporting families in crisis- Incidents of domestic violence and sexual assault both increased as a result of the pandemic. CLUES provided advocacy, crisis management, and support groups to 196 survivors of sexual assault and domestic violence.

# **Advancing Community Prosperity**

**CLUES** fosters economic and racial equity by cultivating access to opportunities and growing institutional and individual assets owned by and for Latinos.

#### Microenterprise

· Forging new paths to economic prosperity- CLUES is empowering our community to be the producers and owners of our own economic prosperity. Our communities are entrepreneurial and want to own their assets. With the support of our microenterprise programs, 38 new Latino-owned businesses were created and 118 full time jobs.

#### Housing

- · Supporting pandemic recovery through housing stability- Stable housing is key to family stability and wellbeing- housing instability peaked during the pandemic. As a result of CLUES housing services and resources, 686 individuals were able to maintain stable housing. \$1,122,272 in direct rental and utilities assistance was provided to families impacted by COVID-19.
- Transitioning to permanent housing- 37 unhoused individuals were provided temporary housing. 62% of individuals in temporary housing transitioned into permanent housing.
- · Capitalizing community assets to meet community needs- Our Mi Casa, Mi Negocio is designed to support families from low-income backgrounds who are interested in home ownership and can purchase duplexes or multi-unit properties. Rental income from the properties will make it possible for our families to afford a mortgage and a home of their own, while building housing equity they can pass on to future generations. CLUES is piloting this program and it is being supported as a promising model.



#### **Employment and Workforce**

- · Connecting individuals to employment- Our team provides responsive services to meet individuals where they are by connecting them with immediate employment opportunities through application assistance, job hiring fairs, and coaching. 256 individuals gained employment with an average salary increase from \$18,720 to \$37,128.
- · Providing pathways to family-sustaining careers-CLUES workforce development programs incorporate employment readiness and financial literacy classes, industry-specific training in customer service, health care, and transportation sectors, career navigation, and wraparound supports. Our aim is to place participants in jobs that pay a family-sustaining wage, offer career advancement, and meet the needs of Minnesota employers who are seeking diverse, skilled workers to fill in-demand jobs in an evolving economy. Last year, the average annual income nearly doubled for participants who were placed in jobs through our services. 99 individuals completed training programs.



#### **Adult Basic Education**

· Investing in skill building for future success- English language skills are critical for many employment opportunities as well accessing community resources. We served 508 participants who received a total of 20,000 hours of English as a Second Language instruction.

#### **Early Childhood**

- · Supporting parents via In-home visiting program- Early childhood education is key to setting kids up for success throughout school. Our team is active in connecting families with resources, information, and tools to support culturally grounded positive early childhood practices. This year, 37 families received in-home parenting support and demonstrated positive responsive parenting techniques and 163 parents participated in early childhood development programming.
- · Addressing gaps in culturally responsive childcare by supporting Latina Friends Family and Neighbor (FFN) early childcare providers -CLUES continues to grow programs to support FFN providers, including providing comprehensive education and trainings around key topics to improve quality of care. CLUES has provided services to 227 participants, including 25 who completed CPR/ AED/First Aid training.

#### **Advancing Community**

# Leadership and Cultural **Engagement**

CLUES works to advance Community Leadership by building, strengthening, and activating community influence, connections, and power to create social and systemic change.

#### **Investing In Our Young Leaders**

- Engaging youth in Science Technology Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM)- Our' Best Buy Teen Tech Center provides youth opportunities for creative expression and exploration in a culturally affirming environment. 294 students were engaged in our Teen
- Creating STEAM-related career pathways for BIPOC youth- 31 youth were placed in paid internships with corporate partners and 73 youth participated in skill building, corporate site visits and/or job shadowing opportunities.
- Empowering Latino youth with resources and information- 130 youth attended our Latino Youth Conference. The event was an opportunity to create community, connect with Latino professionals and community leaders, and gain valuable resources related to college and career pathways.
- Mentorship and leadership development- 77 high school students were mentored through the school year by professionals to support high school graduation and college readiness thorough Youth in Action program (YA!). Our YA! students achieved a 98% on-time graduation.


