

ICE EMERGENCY RESOURCES

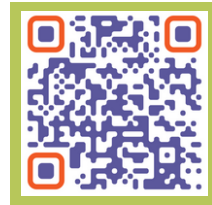
If you're detained by ICE

- **Do not** try to run
- **Do not** act violently. **Do not** be offensive
- **Memorize** the phone number of someone close to **you**
- If they come to your home, **DO NOT** open the door
- You have the right to **remain silent**
- **DO NOT** sign any document, paper, card, etc.
- You may **report and record abuse** by ICE agents
- If you don't speak English, **request an interpreter**

PREPARE A FAMILY PLAN

Delegation of Parental Authority (DOPA): Allows you to designate someone to care for your children if you are unable to do so yourself. **Must be signed in front of a notary public.**

Power of Attorney (POA): A written authorization allowing someone to manage property, business, or financial matters on your behalf, in the way you choose. **It is recommended to complete this with an attorney**

Emergency Contact List: Includes family members, friends, schools, and trusted organizations. Create a list, print it, carry it with you, share it with anyone who may help you, and have them **call your emergency contact in case of a detention.**

Travel consent: If one parent/guardian is present, no consent is needed. If it is a non-custodial guardian, they must complete the form for traveling with the minor.

Family Plan: Define where to reunite and how to communicate in case of separation. Keep copies of passports, birth certificates, and medical records in both physical and digital formats.
